#### Kentucky Derby

2023 Kentucky Derby will be held at Churchill Downs Saturday, May 6. Disarm was the last horse to sneak into the 2023 Kentucky Derby field. The Steve Asmussen-Winchell trained. Thoroughbreds-owned grandson of Tapit finished third in the Lexinaton Stakes earn his way into the 2023 Kentucky Derby lineup. The Louisiana Derby runner-up will run for the third time in a span of just six weeks when he heads to post at the Kentucky Derby 2023.

Disarm is a 33-1 long the shot in 2023 Kentucky Derby odds, but the son of 10-time graded-stakes winner Gun Runner is likely to see his price slashed now that he's officially among 2023 the Kentucky Derby horses. Forte led the Road to Kentucky the Derby standings with 190 points and is also the top three-year-old in career earnings nearly \$2.4 million in winnings. He's the 5-2 favorite in the 2023 Kentucky Derby futures.

A fixture in the horse racing world who has been writing about, talking about and betting on races for years, Demling enters the 2023 Kentucky Derby having nailed the winner of the Belmont Stakes four of the last five years, including an exacta in 2022 with Mo Donegal and Nest. He also nailed Flightline's win at the Breeders' Cup Classic last November.

Demling is at his best in the biggest horse races in the world like the Kentucky Derby 2023. In fact, he has hit 10 of the 14 Derby-Oaks doubles Churchill at Downs. That means he held a ticket with the winners of both races all but four times in the last 14 years. He's also called nine of the last 18 Preakness winners. keenly understanding the Kentucky when Derby winner poised for victory or a massive upset, and nailed the 2022 Preakness trifecta. Anyone who has followed him is up huge.
